### Definitions

#### 1. Limbo

- (*Roman Catholic Church*) The abode of unbaptized but innocent or righteous souls, as those of infants or virtuous individuals who lived before the coming of Christ.)
- A region or condition of oblivion or neglect: Management kept her promotion in limbo for months.
- A state or place of confinement.
- An intermediate place or state.

#### 2. Lustful

- Full of or motivated by lust, greed, or the like: He was an emperor lustful of power.
- Having strong sexual desires; lecherous; libidinous.
- Archaic

#### 3. Gluttonous

- Given to or marked by gluttony.
- Indulging in something, such as an activity, to excess; voracious.
- 

#### 4. Misers

- One who lives very meagerly in order to hoard money.
- A greedy or avaricious person.

#### & Spendthrifts

- One who spends money recklessly or wastefully.
- *adj.*
- Wasteful or extravagant: spendthrift bureaucrats.

#### 5. Wrathful

- Full of wrath; fiercely angry.
- Proceeding from or expressing wrath: wrathful vengeance. (Forceful, often vindictive anger.)

#### & Sullen

- Showing a brooding ill humor or silent resentment; morose or sulky.
- Gloomy or somber in tone, color, or portent: sullen, gray skies.
- Sluggish; slow: the sullen current of a canal.

#### 6. Heretics

- (Christianity / Roman Catholic Church) A person who maintains beliefs contrary to the established teachings of the Church
- A person who holds unorthodox opinions in any field

#### 7. Violent

- Marked by, acting with, or resulting from great force: a violent attack.
- Having or showing great emotional force: violent dislike.
- Marked by intensity; extreme: violent pain; a violent squall.
- Caused by unexpected force or injury rather than by natural causes: a violent death.
- Tending to distort or injure meaning, phrasing, or intent.

#### 8. Fraudulent

- Acting with or having the intent to deceive
- Relating to or proceeding from fraud or dishonest action

#### 9. Traitors

- A person who is guilty of treason or treachery, in betraying friends, country, a cause or trust, etc.
- A person who changes to the enemy's side or gives away information to the enemy  
He was a traitor to his country.
